Mike Gerber, a new Board member, and his wife Lee Ann traveled in Southern and Central Myanmar and Western Thailand visiting churches, 6 Bible Colleges, new mission fields, and surveyed presently unreached areas. Mike preached at several leadership training events and also pulled out of the archives of his experience his agricultural training in Swine Care and Development. Many evangelists in Myanmar are bi-vocational. Raising pigs and rice are a normal part of life. Mike's agricultural background and years of experience became an added bonus to his effectiveness with the leaders. Lee Ann's love for children and children's workers endeared them to her. As she taught them she was a true encouragement to many women and their critical mission.

A second new Board member, Chuck McDaniel traveled intentionally to overlap with Mike and explore with several key Asian leaders the opportunities to expand business training among the church's leaders. As the culture is quickly westernizing under the new government, a need is emerging to equip the church leaders on how to join in the cultural financial movements that are raising the costs of living and creating barriers to further expand the gospel. Creating self-supporting churches and church planting movements into unreached areas remains a primary mission goal of ACS. Perhaps there are some among our readers and ACS supporters that have marketplace experience and teaching gifts and could be used like Mike and Chuck to further equip Asian leaders in the skills needed for the days ahead. During this first quarter, most of the Bible Colleges had graduations releasing many new workers into active service. EBI celebrated its 25th anniversary. Joshua Leme, the founder of EBI - Emmaus Bible Institute, was the first Burmese student to be allowed to study at Cincinnati Bible Seminary Graduate School. Upon his graduation, he

returned to found that college in Yangon for the training of leaders in the southern regions of Burma. It has now graduated many hundreds of evangelists and many new tribes have had churches established. Also, training conferences occurred like the 16th annual Golden Triangle Seminar in MaeSai, Thailand. A new Seminar in MaeSot Thailand on the western border was also held this year for evangelists working among the Burmese Refugees along the border.

And finally, the reach of the evangelists is continuing to expand into new areas. News comes weekly of new conversions and baptisms. The primary reports we hear are from workers that ACS is funding in newer areas. But, the work of the Gospel that has had its roots in

Burma from the Morse's beginnings in 1950 is now indigenous across the country. The churches in the north continue to produce missionaries on their own. Some of the villages are in the midst of the conflict in the land. Sometimes the Christian villages are caught in the crossfire and our help is needed. On behalf of the ACS Board, we thank you for your continuing support in dollars and in prayers. Both are absolutely critical for the furtherance of new work. We confirm the words of the Apostle Paul to the Corinthians in his second letter, 9:12- ***"This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God."*** Thank you and may the Lord continue to bless those in Asia through all of us!

It was just over a year ago after a quick 10 day trip to SE Asia, my wife Lee Ann and I mentioned to Kent Odor the idea of us going to Myanmar and serving for an extended time.

and Mark Morse and many others were extremely encouraging and so after much prayer and not nearly enough preparation, we landed at the Yangon International Airport Christmas week. We were naïve and curious and excited about the experience but had literally no idea how God might use this experience to shape us or use us.

The next two months were an amazing and powerful time. We traveled to places all over Myanmar and Thailand visiting ministries and new churches and potential church sites. We were able to teach and encourage and learn. We were able to pray with them and hear their stories. We were able to share in the teaching at a couple of seminars for evangelists and pastors as well as teach at Bible training centers. I was even able to share lessons about the art of raising pigs to pastors searching for ways to feed their families and supply their ministries! I watched as Lee Ann, armed with

flannel graph figures and a good translator, told Bible stories to little children who stared with wide eyes and giggling anticipation. We watched as groups of kids came to the stage during worship each week and sang and danced to songs of praise for our King while Buddhist parents watched with a mixture of pride and curiosity.

And of course, we met so many faithful and Godly men and women serving our Lord often in hard and difficult situations and yet their primary concern was the lost people among whom they lived and served. Many of them made such an impact on us that they have become permanent additions to our personal prayer lists.

We continue to process what we have learned and what God is trying to teach us through all of this. Of course, the lessons and challenges occurred at many different levels but one thing is abundantly clear from the last few months. ACS is making a difference! If you are reading these words YOU ARE MAKING A DIFFERENCE in the Kingdom!

Ruth and Cherry, our youngest daughter, are at Lehe, the Naga land conducting the first Christian Women seminar. Cherry is teaching the Naga women along with her mother.

Through the Lord's grace, Ruth and Cherry have done two seminars, one at Lehe and another at Khamti successfully. These seminars were more than successful. Especially from the trip and the seminar at Lehe, Ruth and Cherry have learned in how much difficult situations, our TBC Naga students are serving the Lord. The Naga people are very poor, superstitious, uneducated and ignorant. Our students have to endure many kinds of difficulties, troubles and hardships in sharing the gospel among their own people. There are now 5 our Naga students

who are spreading the gospel among their own people. One of them, a student named Timothy, called and shared with me a good news that he got 15 baptisms of new converts on last Saturday. PRAISE THE LORD! There are still hundreds and hundreds of Naga villages who don't know Jesus Christ. Therefore, there is a lot work to be done there....

On this trip, Cherry taught the Naga women CHE lessons. They were so thankful to her because they have learned many things that they should know. Some Naga women came to attend the seminar from two days of journey on foot and some mothers came to the seminar with bringing babysitters for their babies. Ruth and Cherry also sadly learned from the Naga women that according to their culture, the Naga men are not giving much care to their wives in the time of child-birth. Therefore, Ruth and Cherry were

asked to let me come to conduct a men's seminar for their husbands in the next year. Therefore, I will have to go back to Lehe to teach the Naga men if the Lord willing. The villagers are very poor and even they don't have enough blankets and thus, at night they have to make a fire under their bed. Because of this, sometimes, their houses catch fire accidentally. Our Asian brothers and sisters exhibit a faithfulness to Christ and His cause that is both inspiring and challenging. Their diligence to persevere under all circumstances is humbling to those of us who get to hear their testimony and try to share their load. Most recently a pioneer evangelist in Shan State, Myanmar left this life on earth and received his eternal reward. He had been an evangelist in a Buddhist village with no Christians of any denomination nearby for the last ten years. His support system was the leader who had

trained him and ordained him to the work and some other evangelists who lived far away. He received \$100 a month through ACS for many of those years. He established a strong church and had many conversions. He even led the youth of his church to travel to other villages on "mission trips" to serve others and learn to evangelize.

He was led to Christ as a Buddhist young man by the family of his future wife. His wife's father, as a young man, carried the preschooler Ruth Margaret Morse over the snowy mountains in China to the Salween Valley after the J Russell Morse home was destroyed by a flash flood. Steven became a powerful evangelist and his youngest daughter married Sai Tun Aye, our Shan Evangelist. Of late, Sai Tun Aye was diagnosed with Sugar diabetes and Tuberculosis. There is no treatment for that in his remote area. He left a widow with two teenage sons and a vibrant church of several hundred heaven bound believers. At his funeral, four more young people were baptized. That is not a normal funeral. This "missionary family's" testimony is a true inspiration for all of us. Thank you for supporting ACS workers like Sai Tun Aye. Together we will have a long fellowship in Heaven.

We are going to Laos to Bowkeaw province for Laos Children Mission on March 4-5, 2018. Please pray and help for their need in daily food's. And we

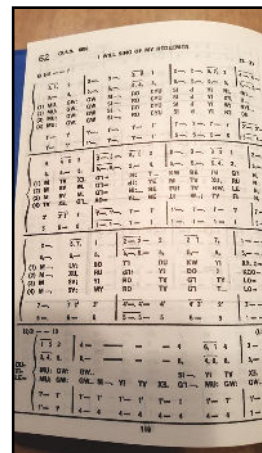

FEDWELL NUTRIOUS FOOD - My Canadian Friend Danny Schat has a food factory in Myanmar and he donated 160,000 meals (Worth US\$ 20,000) of Food to the poor. We shipped these foods to refugees in the north and west.

PASSING CHECK POINTS - God is faithful and protected us. All the food safely arrived in Myitkyina after shipping 7 days by train. It took 4 days to ship to the west.

2. Scholarships for poor children. (\$40 per month)

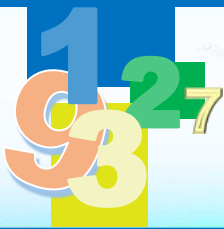

STADIA needs church planting sponsors to partner with us to provide \$30,000 for each building of these pre-school/church plant models.

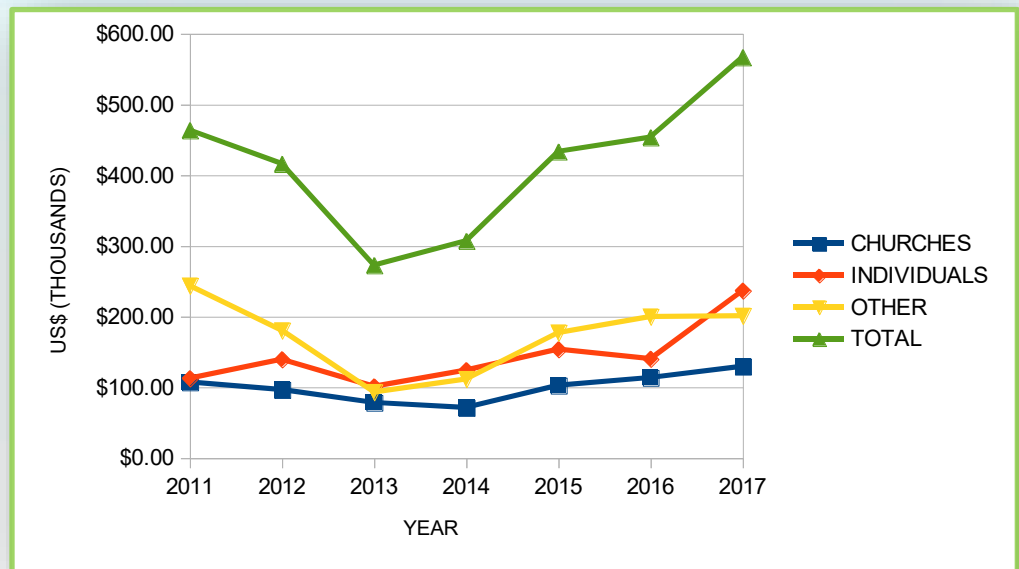
ACS needs church planting sponsors to partner with us to provide \$8000 for each church planting evangelist to pastor the church and \$8000 for each Preschool team to teach the children. These funds will be distributed and diminished over 3-4 years to allow the churches and the pre-schools to become self-sustaining. These investments will provide life-changing impact on the children and will introduce the entire Buddhist community to the Gospel.



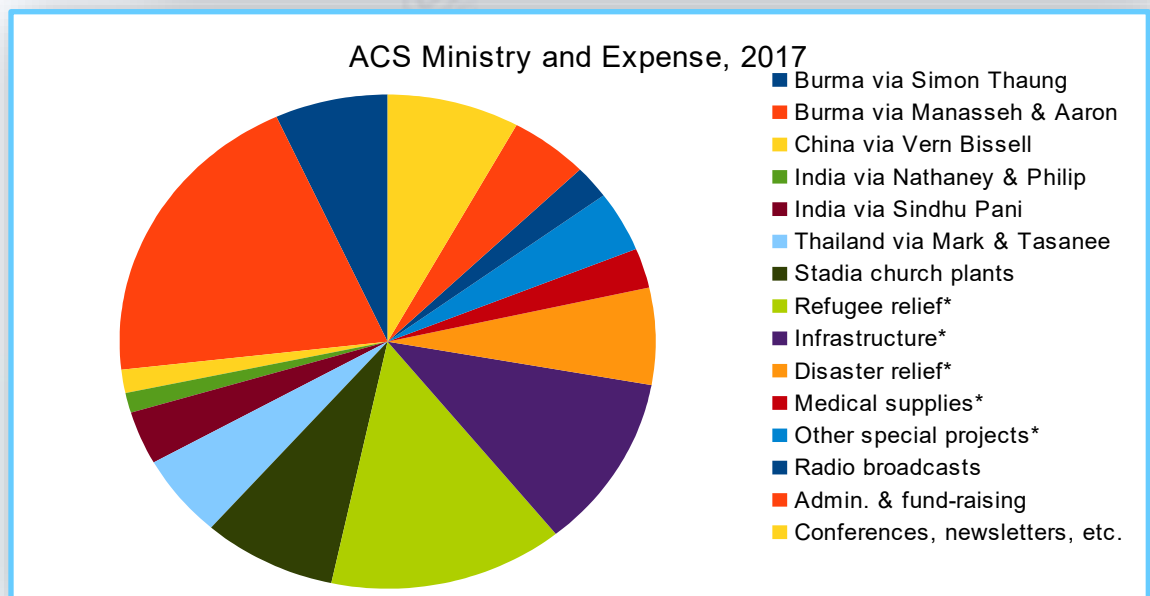
ACS "By the Numbers" In Summary

The chart to the right shows the ACS income by year as given by churches, by individuals, and by other groups such as our partners at IDES for the frequent disasters in SE Asia. Total income in recent years was lowest in 2013 as LaVerne Morse suffered the severe pneumonia that kept him from further active oversight of the Mission. Mark Morse and Kent and Marcia Odor began to step in to take over the Mission's work, and Kent was asked by the ACS Board to provide administrative and fund-raising assistance as a contractor in early 2017, a necessity for the new partnership with Stadia and essential as well for advancing the Mission.



For 2017, ACS ministry and expense is shown in the pie chart (the legend labels the slices going counter clockwise from 12 o'clock). For ministry, the legend lists the country along with ACS's primary accountability partner through whom the ministry was performed and the finances were distributed. Ministry was 87.26% of the total, administration and fund-raising was 4.75%, and other expenses (conferences, newsletters, insurance, etc. were 7.98%)
